# Combatting senior isolation & loneliness

Growing older, growing isolated – loneliness and its impact on seniors

#### **Why This Matters**



- Loneliness is more than just a feeling—it's a growing public health concern spanning all age groups.
- Older adults are especially vulnerable due to life changes like retirement, loss of loved ones, or health decline.
- Understanding the impact can inform better interventions.
- Reduce Caregivers burnout.



#### **Key Definitions**

- Loneliness: Subjective feeling of being alone or disconnected, lack of meaningful social connection.
- Social Isolation: Objective lack of social contact and support leading to loneliness and potentially negative health outcomes.

#### What Causes Loneliness in Seniors?

- Loss of spouse/partners
- Loss of mobility or hearing impairments
- Lack of Transportation or Resource Constraints
- Retirement and loss of social roles
- Living Alone
- Major Health Emergencies
- Cultural Differences



#### How Common is Loneliness in Older Adults?

- 1 in 3 older adults experiences loneliness regularly.
- Around 25-30% of adults over 65 are socially isolated.

#### **Loneliness Among Immigrant Seniors in the U.S.**

- Immigrant seniors are more likely to experience loneliness due to:
  - Language barriers
  - Cultural differences
  - Separation from extended family
  - Limited access to culturally appropriate services





#### **Immigrant Older Adult Trends**

- Approximately 15% of U.S. seniors are immigrants, with higher rates in urban areas.
- By 2060, foreign born seniors will make up almost 25% of the US population, according to the U.S. Census Bureau.
- Studies show immigrant seniors report higher levels of emotional and social loneliness than U.S.-born counterparts.



#### **KING5: Facing Race**



The U.S. elderly care system is already challenging. For immigrant families working to overcome language barriers and isolation, they carry an even heavier load. (Dec 18, 2024)

#### **The Health Impact**

- Mental Health: Increased risk of depression, anxiety, and cognitive decline.
- Physical Health: Higher risk of heart disease, stroke, and premature death.
- Sleep: Poorer sleep quality and higher sleep disturbances.

#### What Can Be Done?

- Community Programs: Program for All-inclusive Care of the Elderly (PACE), Senior centers, Meals on Wheels, etc.
- Technology Training: Teaching video calls/social media.
- Volunteering & Mentorship: Gives purpose and social engagement.
- Healthcare Screening: Incorporating loneliness checks in visits.
- Tailored interventions—language-specific programs, cultural community centers, and accessible transportation.



#### **Real-World Impact – A Community Response**



- Address barriers
- Improve engagement

- Create connection

- Americans with unmet transportation needs <u>**2.6**</u> times more likely to report multiple emergency room visits

#### **Federal Changes**



- 340B & Prescription Drugs
- DEI
- Federal Agency Staffing
- Gender Affirming Care
- Grant Administration
- Immigration
- Language Access
- Workforce

#### Agency Implementation

- Temporary pause on all federal grant funds
- Changes to terms and conditions of grants
- DOGE: written justification for grant drawdowns

#### Congressional Action: Budget Reconciliation

- "One Big Beautiful Bill"
- Work Requirements
- 10% Reduction of Federal Match (FMAP)
- Pause on new provider taxes
- Stricter eligibility verification



#### **Messaging on Impacts: House Budget**

\$700B

#### **Cut from Medicaid**

Proposed cuts to Advanced Premium Tax Credits (APTCs) will make marketplace coverage less affordable.

Cut to SNAP will reduce access to free-to-low cost food.



Increase in the uninsured population of Washington

Increase demand for uncompensated care, decreases CHC revenue.

56% of WA CHC patients covered by Medicaid

CHCs care for more than 35% of WA Medicaid enrollees

#### 281,606\*

People in WA who could lose Medicaid coverage due to work requirements

\*Estimated 140,803 - 281,606 will lose coverage depending on how implemented

Work requirements will reduce CHC revenue -Projected cumulative shortfalls from 2029-2032 range from \$1.1B to \$2.3b.



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#### **CHCs and Medicaid**

CHC Mission: Serve all, comprehensive & affordable care, accountable.

CHCs serve a large portion of Medicaid patients nationally and in our state. Medicaid revenue is a substantial part of CHC financial sustainability.

More than 1 in 6 (16 million people) nationally.

 In Washington, 56% of CHC patients are covered by Medicaid.  Medicaid payments represent 61% of Washington CHCs' overall revenue. CHCs focus on preventative care, improving health and lowering costs.

 Nationally, CHCs care for around 18% of all Medicaid beneficiaries but only account for 2.1% of Medicaid spending.

• CHCs saved Medicaid \$38.6 billion by keeping patients healthy and avoiding unnecessary costs such as trips to the emergency room.
